## **Rubric for Social Connections**


### ***Social Connections***

***Having friends, family members, neighbors, and others who provide emotional support and concrete assistance to caregivers.***


- 0 Providers do not address building social connections.
- 1 Providers provide caregivers with information about support groups, social events, neighborhood activities, religious activities, and other formal and informal means for the caregivers to connect with other people.
- 2 Providers and the caregiver engage in dialogue to set goals/interests regarding social connections; encourage caregivers to deepen current positive relationships; and encourage caregivers' involvement in activities appropriate to caregivers' goals and interests related to having a healthy supportive social network, including activities to celebrate their successes and family milestones.
- 3 Providers and the caregiver periodically review together the status of caregivers' social networks and where additional connections would be beneficial to the caregiver. Providers support the caregivers in building relationships, including coaching the caregivers and facilitating the caregivers' first steps in building new relationships. Providers help caregivers develop skills needed to address any challenges/difficulties in building and maintaining their social connections.
- 4 Providers have engaged with caregivers as described in level 3 and have evidence that caregivers periodically assess the extent and nature of their social connections and request assistance, coaching and information when needed from providers in order to strengthen their social connections with those who can provide needed emotional and concrete assistance. Providers have evidence that caregivers are connected with other caregivers and family members who are skilled at using and building protective factors.


