Dear Mr. DePaulis:

We are pleased to inform you that Utah has successfully completed its Improvement Plan under the Federal Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) Assessment Review.

In July 2005, the Children's Bureau completed an onsite review of the State's AFCARS data. The AFCARS Assessment Review (AAR) evaluates the ability of the State's automated information system to collect, extract, and submit AFCARS data, and assesses the accuracy of the data collected in accordance with the definitions of the data elements specified in Federal regulations and policy. In addition to reviewing technical documentation, the review also includes a review of foster care and adoption case records (paper files) to compare the information found in the paper files with the electronic data submitted for those cases to ensure accuracy, timely data entry, and completeness in the conversion of historical information.

While the AFCARS Assessment Review is considered complete, we encourage you to continue to build upon the processes you have implemented to ensure accurate, quality data. In addition, we note that some issues addressed through the AFCARS Improvement Plan relating to placements overlap with items in the State's Child and Family Services Review (CFSR) Program Improvement Plan (PIP). While for the purposes of the AFCARS Improvement Plan, we find these tasks to be complete and the State is correctly extracting placements that are to be counted for AFCARS, the State must complete all actions specified in the CFSR PIP and also ensure that efforts are made to sustain the improvements over time. We also want to remind the State that the State's title IV-B Child and Family Services Plan and Annual Progress and Services Report as part of the information required by 45 CFR 1357.15(t) and 45 CFR 1357.16(a)(5) is to include information on changes to the system and caseworker training.
