Footnote for each table:

All 50 states plus the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico are required to collect and report NYTD data. States were required to collect baseline outcomes information from youth who turned age 17 while in foster care in FFY 2014. At follow-up, states were required to survey youth during the six-month reporting periods in which they turned age 19 (in FFY 16) and 21 (in FFY 18).

Footnote for Substance Abuse:

\*In FFY 2014, youth were asked at age 17 if they had ever been referred for substance abuse counseling or treatment at some point in their lives. In FFYs 2016 and 2018, youth were asked if they had been referred within the past two years.
