<b>Program Vision</b>	Native American Professional Parent Resources, Inc. Tribal Home Visiting vision is to build healthy families and strong communities for Native American children and families of New Mexico.
<b>Program Goals</b>	(1) Increase Native family empowerment through positive parenting approaches and interactions, support for culturally-relevant practices, caregiver recognition of their child's overall development including their strengths and challenges, and increasing knowledge around child and family health, mental health, well-being, and resources. (2) Increase family engagement through home visits, socializations, and other program activities. (3) Improve the quality of Tribal Home Visiting services through evaluation, continuous quality improvement, and rigorous evaluation study activities. (4) Increase urban, rural, and tribal community and service provider engagement to support Tribal Home Visiting program implementation activities. (5) Improve Tribal Home Visiting services for Native families and children of New Mexico. (6) Improve family and child health, well-being, and school-readiness. (7) Improve caregiver-child relationships and interactions. (8) Improve family empowerment and advocacy. (9) Improve early childhood systems for Native American families in urban and rural communities. (10) Contribute to the overall knowledge base of effective Home Visiting services in urban and rural tribal communities and families.

<b>Population Served</b>	Native American families who are expecting and families with young children between the ages of 0-5 years old, residing in the service areas of Bernalillo, Cibola and Sandoval counties, in both urban and rural communities.
<b>Ages of Children Served</b>	Prenatal to kindergarten entry
<b>Model</b>	Parents as Teachers
<b>Other Program Components</b>	(1) Enhancement: Utilization of Tribal Home Visiting culturally enhanced activities that promote and facilitate indigenous traditional values of the tribes of the Southwest. (2) Supplement: Utilization of the Circle of Security Parenting intervention program designed to improve the developmental attachment and relationship between the caregivers and their children.
