Grant Goals

Program Vision	Dedicated to equity, health, education, and wellness for American Indian, Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander families and cultures in King County.
Program Goals	(1) Support the well-being of urban Native children and families including critical maternal and child health, development, early learning, family support, and child abuse and neglect prevention with a home visitation intervention created for the urban AIAN/NHPI community. (2) Provide a culturally tailored early childhood home visiting program for urban Native children and caregivers in King County. (3) Contribute to building an evidence-base for home visiting interventions for the urban Native community. (4) Develop a system of care and early childhood linkages in King County for AIAN/NHPI children and families.

Other Program Components	(1) Adaptation: IMFP cultural adaptation curriculum for home visiting. (2) Enhancement: Provides culturally-enhanced modules on home visits, utilizing Native books and materials, and hiring Kias or Elders/grandmas. (3) Supplement: Promoting First Relationships is a 10-week strength-based parenting program that provides parents with practical information about how to support children's social and emotional growth. (4) Supplement: Positive Indian Parenting is an 8 to 10 week curriculum that provides practical and culturally specific training for American Indian and Alaska Native parents.
