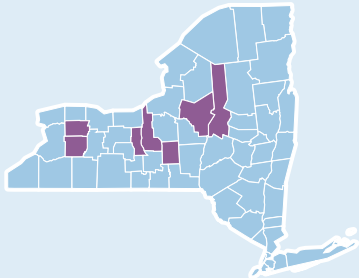


# How to Enroll in Your Local Diaper Distribution Pilot Program

■ = counties served by NYSCAA



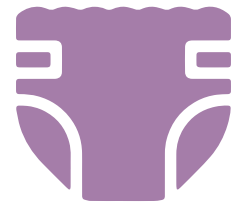

## How can NYSCAA help my family?

- Families can receive diapers every month.
- Once enrolled in the diaper program pilot, you can also receive help with home visitation, LIHEAP, weatherization, Early Head Start and Head Start, employment services, and WIC.

## How do I get diapers?

You may be eligible if your family income is at or below 200% FPL. Exceptions may be made if there are multiple children in diapers within the family.



### • Community Action Programs of Cayuga/Seneca

- Participants must be working with one of the partner agencies.

### • Wyoming County Community Action

- Diapers can be picked up at scheduled times convenient for the family.

### • Mohawk Valley Community Action Agency

- Appointments must be made to receive diapers. Existing clients are called to set up a pick-up time. New clients are called once the diapers they need are available.
- Pre-enrollment is completed by calling central intake at **315-624-9930**.
- Need to bring proof of income eligibility.

### • Cortland County Community Action Program

- Distribute by appointment the last week of every month.
