Prior to FY 2015, the number of households assisted with winter crisis assistance or year-round crisis assistance were reported together in the *LIHEAP Household Report*. Beginning with the *LIHEAP Household Report for FY 2015*, states were asked to report the number of households assisted with winter crisis assistance separately from the number of households assisted with year-round crisis assistance.

ⁱⁱ The total number of states providing cooling assistance benefits to households (20) differs from the total number of states obligated funding to cooling assistance (19, see Table I-6) because one state (North Dakota) assisted households with non-crisis cooling equipment repair and replacement services using funding obligated to emergency cooling equipment repair and replacement, but reported such households under cooling assistance

ⁱⁱⁱ Households in winter fuel crisis situations (Alaska, Kansas, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Washington) or year-round fuel crisis situations (Maryland) were assisted solely through expedited heating assistance. Alaska and Massachusetts reported these household counts under the type of crisis assistance, but reported the funding obligated under heating assistance (Table I-7).

^{iv} The national total unduplicated count of households receiving any type of LIHEAP assistance is not available as data were reported incorrectly by two states (Texas and West Virginia). These instances are marked with “NA” as data were not available.

^v The following states provided emergency heating/cooling repairs or replacements to households as part of their energy crisis benefits. These households are excluded from the crisis assistance counts from Table III-2: California (4,790), Colorado (1,433), District of Columbia (89), Idaho (685), Illinois (940), Iowa (791), Maine (9), Maryland (217), Michigan (887), Minnesota (4,692), Mississippi (1,675), Missouri (172), Montana (594), Nebraska (147), New Jersey (4,065), New York (1,466), North Carolina (1,249; done on a non-emergency basis), North Dakota (932), Ohio (32), Oregon (385), Pennsylvania (6,719), Rhode Island (545), South Carolina (804), South Dakota (547), Texas (1,591), Utah (316), Virginia (2,306), Washington (350), West Virginia (105), Wisconsin (454), and Wyoming (466).
