These states reported these households under heating assistance.

<sup>iii</sup> Households in winter fuel crisis situations (Alaska, Kansas, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Washington) or year-round fuel crisis situations (Maryland) were assisted solely through expedited heating assistance. Massachusetts reported these household counts under the type of crisis assistance, but reported the funding obligated under heating assistance (Table I-7).

<sup>iv</sup> The following states provided emergency heating/cooling repairs or replacements to households as part of their energy crisis benefits. These households are excluded from the crisis assistance counts from Table III-2: California (4,351), Colorado (1,414), District of Columbia (93), Idaho (178), Illinois (866), Iowa (791), Maine (13), Maryland (376), Michigan (881), Minnesota (4,289), Mississippi (3,384; done on an emergency or non-emergency basis), Missouri (155), Montana (834), Nebraska (75), New Jersey (4,140), New York (2,307), North Carolina (1,004), North Dakota (944), Ohio (133), Oregon (317), Pennsylvania (7,890), Rhode Island (93), South Carolina (215), South Dakota (552), Texas (524), Utah (316), Vermont (86), Virginia (2,317), Washington (460), Wisconsin (482), and Wyoming (382).
