<sup>iii</sup> The total number of states providing winter crisis benefits to households (28) includes data for households assisted by 1 state (Massachusetts) that did not obligate FY 2018 funds for winter crisis assistance. Instead, the state provided winter crisis fuel assistance solely by expediting heating assistance within a statutorily required crisis response timeframe.

These states reported these households under heating assistance.

<sup>iii</sup> Households in winter fuel crisis situations (Alaska, Kansas, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Washington) or year-round fuel crisis situations (Maryland) were assisted solely through expedited heating assistance. Massachusetts reported these household counts under the type of crisis assistance but reported the funding obligated under heating assistance (Table I-7).

<sup>iv</sup> The following states provided emergency heating/cooling repairs or replacements to households as part of their energy crisis benefits. These households are excluded from the crisis assistance counts from Table III-2: Alaska (117), California (4,303), Colorado (1,324), District of Columbia (80), Idaho (147), Illinois (735), Iowa (731), Maine (24), Maryland (368), Michigan (785), Minnesota (4,767), Mississippi (2,008; done on an emergency or non-emergency basis), Missouri (71), Montana (1,261), New Jersey (5,237), New York (2,207), North Dakota (966), Ohio (146), Oregon (280), Pennsylvania (8,706), Rhode Island (327), South Carolina (308), South Dakota (503), Texas (1,089), Utah (365), Vermont ([furnace repair/replacement – 288] and [tank replacement – 136]), Virginia (2,488), Washington (426), West Virginia (1,137), Wisconsin (507), and Wyoming (317).

These households are not included in the household counts in Table III-2: Connecticut, 88,536 - \$20.01 benefits; Maine, 7,964 - \$21 benefits; Massachusetts, 126,248 - \$21 benefits; Michigan, 167,908 - \$20.01 benefits; Montana, 991 - \$25 benefits or 5% of the amount of a regular LIHEAP benefit; New York, 274,532 - \$21 benefits; Oregon, 45,263 - \$21 benefits; Pennsylvania, 271,874 - \$21 to \$24 benefits; Rhode Island, 13,353 - \$20.01 benefits; Washington, 212,493 - \$20.01 benefits.
