ⁱⁱ The total number of states providing cooling assistance benefits to households (24) differs from the total number of states that obligated funding to cooling assistance (23, see Table I-6) because 1 state (North Dakota) assisted households with non-crisis cooling equipment repair and replacement services using funding obligated to emergency cooling equipment repair and replacement but reported such households under cooling assistance.

ⁱⁱⁱ The total number of states providing winter crisis benefits to households (25) includes data for households assisted by 3 states (Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Washington) that did not obligate FY 2020 funds for winter crisis assistance. Instead, the state provided winter crisis fuel assistance solely by expediting heating assistance within a statutorily required crisis response timeframe. The total also excludes data for households assisted by 1 state (Alaska) that provided winter crisis fuel assistance solely by expediting heating assistance and reported these household under heating assistance only.

^{iv} West Virginia's unduplicated count of households receiving any type of assistance excludes households who only received Emergency Furnace Repair and Replacement and/or Weatherization Assistance because the state has not developed procedures for comparing LIHEAP bill payment assistance beneficiaries with LIHEAP funded weatherization and/or emergency repair and replacement beneficiaries.

These states reported these households under heating assistance.

ⁱⁱⁱ Households in winter fuel crisis situations (Alaska, Kansas, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Washington) or year-round fuel crisis situations (Maryland) were assisted solely through expedited heating assistance. Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Washington reported these household counts under the type of crisis assistance but reported the funding obligated under heating assistance (Table I-7). Alaska reported these household under heating assistance only.

^{iv} The following states provided emergency heating/cooling repairs or replacements to households as part of their energy crisis benefits. These households are excluded from the crisis assistance counts from Table III-2: Alaska (64), California (3,327), Colorado (252), District of Columbia (212), Idaho (7), Illinois (792), Indiana (246), Iowa (594), Maine (17), Maryland (397), Michigan (836), Minnesota (4,132), Mississippi (1,365; done on an emergency or non-emergency basis), Missouri ([Emergency Furnace Repair and Replacement – 34] and [Air Conditioner Purchase – 127]), Montana (754), New Jersey (2,998), New York (1,994), North Dakota (965), Ohio (250), Oregon (184), Pennsylvania (7,198), Rhode Island (299), South Dakota (504), Texas (800), Utah (291), Vermont ([furnace repair/replacement – 415] and [tank replacement – 177]), Virginia (2,257), Washington (289), West Virginia (890), Wisconsin (478), and Wyoming (360).

^v California provided additional crisis assistance to 244 households that received Severe Weather Energy Assistance and Transportation Services (SWEATS).

^{vi} The following states provided nominal benefits for SNAP households and reported the number of households assisted. These households are not included in the household counts in Table III-2: Connecticut, 84,661 - \$20.01 benefits; Maine, 7,307 - \$21 benefits; Massachusetts, 118,759 - \$21 benefits; Michigan, 90,171 - \$20.01 benefits; Montana, 1,320 - \$25 benefits or 5% of the amount of a regular LIHEAP benefit; New York, 299,532 - \$21 benefits; Oregon, 39,986 - \$21 benefits; Pennsylvania, 286,281 - \$21 to \$24 benefits; Rhode Island, 38,637 - \$20.01 benefits; Washington, 212,393 - \$20.01 benefits.
