<sup>ii</sup> The total number of states providing cooling assistance benefits to households (25) differs from the total number of states that obligated funding to cooling assistance (24, see Table I-6) because 1 state (North Dakota) assisted households with non-crisis cooling equipment repair and replacement services using funding obligated to emergency cooling equipment repair and replacement but reported such households under cooling assistance.

<sup>iii</sup> The total number of states providing winter crisis benefits to households (24) includes data for households assisted by 3 states (Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Washington) that did not obligate FY 2021 funds for winter crisis assistance. Instead, the states provided winter crisis fuel assistance solely by expediting heating assistance within a statutorily required crisis response timeframe.

<sup>iv</sup> The total number of states providing weatherization assistance benefits to households (50) differs from the total number of states that obligated funding to weatherization assistance (49, see Table I-6) because 1 state (Mississippi) assisted households with weatherization assistance during FY 2021 using only FY 2020 funds.

<sup>ii</sup> A designation of “--” applies to those states that did not provide a separate count for cooling assistance because: (1) their heating assistance household counts include, and cooling assistance counts exclude, households that received combined heating and cooling assistance (Nevada), or (2) households received energy assistance with no differentiation made between heating and cooling assistance (Hawaii). These states reported these households under heating assistance.

<sup>iii</sup> Households in winter fuel crisis situations (Kansas, Massachusetts, and New Hampshire) or year-round fuel crisis situations (Alaska, Maryland, and Washington) were assisted solely through expedited heating assistance. Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Washington reported these household counts under the type of crisis assistance but reported the funding obligated under heating assistance (Table I-7).

<sup>iv</sup> The following states provided emergency heating/cooling repairs or replacements to households as part of their energy crisis benefits. These households are excluded from the crisis assistance counts from Table III-2: California (2,862), Colorado (2,343), District of Columbia (279), Idaho (13), Illinois (1,318), Indiana (183), Iowa (385), Maine (10), Maryland (583), Michigan (762), Minnesota (4,020), Mississippi (1,554), Missouri ([Emergency Furnace Repair and Replacement – 37] and [Air Conditioner Purchase – 116]), Montana (745), New Jersey (5,425), New York (2,039), North Dakota (922), Ohio (259), Oregon (187), Pennsylvania (5,983), Rhode Island (507), South Dakota (432), Texas (460), Utah (260), Vermont ([furnace repair/replacement – 355] and [tank replacement – 194]), Virginia (2,239), Washington (239), West Virginia (1,349), Wisconsin (669), and Wyoming (319).

<sup>v</sup> California provided additional crisis assistance to 189 households through the Severe Weather Energy Assistance and Transportation Services (SWEATS) program and the Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) pilot program.

<sup>vi</sup> The following states provided nominal benefits for SNAP households and reported the number of households assisted. These households are not included in the household counts in Table III-2: Connecticut, 91,448 - \$20.01 benefits; Maine, 8,095 - \$21 benefits; Massachusetts, 136,181 - \$21 benefits; Michigan, 90,180 - \$20.01 benefits; Montana, 1,000 - \$25 benefits or 5 percent of the amount of a regular LIHEAP benefit; New York, 298,448 - \$21 benefits; Oregon, 31,173 - \$21 benefits; Pennsylvania, 290,954 - \$21 to \$24 benefits; Rhode Island, 42,081 - \$20.01 benefits; Washington, 183,385 - \$20.01 benefits.
