Uniform data on households classified by intervals of the 2014 HHS Poverty Guidelines (HHSPG) ranged from 99.7 percent for weatherization assistance to 100 percent for all other types of assistance (heating, cooling, winter crisis, year-round crisis, and summer crisis assistance). <sup>2</sup> Poverty percentages are computed using gross household incomes adjusted by household size. However, there are states that use net household income in determining income eligibility. For those states, the distribution of poverty percentages could be skewed towards the higher end of the poverty level.

<sup>3</sup> Two states (Maine, Washington) were unable to provide income data on a total of 202 weatherized households. As a result, percentages of households receiving weatherization assistance by 2014 HHSPG add up to less than 100%.
