(1) Definitions of "elderly," "disabled," and "young child" are as follows: "elderly" refers to a person who is 60 years old or older, "disability" varies from state-to-state, and "young child" refers to a person who is five years old or younger. A household could have members that were reported in more than one of the three groups of vulnerable households. (2) National percentages are calculated for those states which reported complete data, by type of LIHEAP assistance. Table A-1 in Appendix A indicates the percentages of assisted households for which uniform data are provided. Uniform data on households classified as vulnerable ranged from 85.8 percent to 100 percent. Uniform data for an unduplicated count of vulnerable members in each household was lower as some states were unable to provide this data.
