Uniform data for cooling assistance was 100 percent for each type of vulnerable household and 88.7 percent for the unduplicated count of households with any vulnerable member because 1 state was unable to provide complete data. For winter crisis assistance, uniform data was 100 percent for each type of vulnerable household and 98.6 percent for the unduplicated count of households with any vulnerable member because 1 state was unable to provide complete data.
