Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

KENTUCKY LIHWAP PROFILE SUMMARY



The Kentucky Department for Community Based Services (DCBS) Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is funded at nearly \$18.7 million in FY21. The program addresses the needs of many low-income households that are struggling with paying their water bills. Data from Louisville Metro water company indicates that close to 12,000 customers are at risk of disconnection of water and/or wastewater services, about 1,700 are currently on a default payment plan, with another anticipated 4,600 customers to be added if payment arrangements are not made. The state utilizes LIHWAP grant funds to restore services to provide relief to assist low-income households with water and wastewater bills.

Program Operation

Kentucky's LIHWAP, which began in December 2021, is managed at the state level in coordination with Community Action Kentucky, Inc. (CAK) who subcontracts with 22 Community Action Agencies across the state and one local government to administer the program. Kentucky's LIHWAP provides relief assistance to **three priority groups**:

- Households facing disconnections or reconnections
- Households with arrearages
- Households with current amount due



Benefits on Behalf of Households

Under Kentucky's LIHWAP, eligible households may receive up to \$1,200 in benefit assistance. Administering agencies prioritize households facing disconnections or reconnections followed by households with arrearages and then households with current amount due. Eligible households may receive both subsidy and crisis benefits up to the allowable maximum amount during the program year.

Priority Populations

Households that meet program eligibility criteria and fall into one of the following categories are given eligibility priority. In addition, household applicants

Program Outreach Activities

- Place posters/flyers in local and county social service offices, offices of aging, Social Security offices, Veterans Affairs, etc.
- Publication of articles or public service announcements in local newspapers or broadcast media announcements.
- Automated phone campaigns and/or social media outreach
- Inform low-income applicants of the availability of all types of LIHWAP assistance at application intake for other low-income programs.
