Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

LOUISIANA LIHWAP PROFILE SUMMARY



The Louisiana Housing Corporation Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is funded at nearly \$20.8 million in FY21. The program addresses the need to provide access to safe and affordable drinking water and wastewater services for many of the state's low-income households. Available data indicates that as of May 31, 2021, 19% of Orleans Parish customers (22,914) had accounts that were greater than 60 days past due with an average amount owed greater than \$1,800. Orleans Parish makes up 10.4% of Louisiana's individuals living in poverty. The state uses LIHWAP grant funds to assist low-income households with water and wastewater bills

Program Operation

Louisiana's LIHWAP, which began in December 2021, is managed and operated at the state level in coordination with other programs available to low-income households and in partnership with 39 administering agencies that include Community Action Agencies (CAA) and local and county governments. Louisiana's LIHWAP provides relief assistance to **three priority groups** served in the following order:

- Households with disconnected water services for immediate restoration of services
- Households with arrearages to prevent disconnection of water services
- Households seeking assistance with current water bills

Administering agency staff conduct outreach activities and determine client eligibility, while state agency staff process benefit payments to water vendors.



Benefits on Behalf of Households

Under Louisiana's LIHWAP, eligible households with disconnected water services and households with arrearages may receive up to \$1,500 in benefit assistance. Households seeking assistance with current water bills receive assistance based on the household's income, size, and water/wastewater burden. Households with no income are eligible to receive the maximum benefit payment allowed for their family size.

Priority Populations

Households that meet program eligibility criteria and fall into one of the following categories are eligible for one additional \$100 benefit payment:

- √ Families with young children
- ✓ Older Adult/Seniors (60+)
- ✓ Disabled individuals

Program Outreach Activities

- Place posters/flyers in local and county social service offices, offices of aging, Social Security offices, Veterans Affairs, etc.
- Publication of articles or public service announcements in local newspapers or broadcast media announcements.
- Automated phone campaigns and/or social media outreach
- Multi-lingual announcements in languages spoken by low-income households within utility service area and/or notification in ethnic language news and broadcast media outlets
- Inform low-income applicants of the availability of all types of LIHWAP assistance at application intake for other low-income programs.
- Outreach to faith-based institutions, including those serving low-income people and people of color.
- Referrals by healthcare, State, and other organizations through Aunt Bertha (findhelp.org) and Unite Us Louisiana (Louisiana.uniteus.com).
- Presentations at community and school meetings.
