# Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

LUMMI NATION LIHWAP PROFILE SUMMARY



The Lummi Nation Low Income Household Water
Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is funded at \$123,563 in
FY21. The program addresses the current need for
assistance among Lummi Nation members who, due to the
COVID-19 pandemic, have faced new economic pressures.
The Lummi Nation LIHWAP aims to provide Tribal members
assistance to reduce their water and wastewater bills and
ensure Tribal members have reliable sources of drinking
water and waste disposal.

# **Program Operation**

Bishop Paiute Tribe's LIHWAP, which began in January 2022, is managed and operated by the Community Services Program in coordination with other programs available to low-income households. The Lummi Nation's LIHWAP provides relief assistance to **three priority groups**:

- Customers whose water and wastewater services have been disconnected
- Customers with arrearages who are at risk of disconnection
- Customers that need assistance paying their current water and/or wastewater bill

Community Services Program staff conduct outreach activities, determine client eligibility, and process benefit payments to water service providers.



#### Benefits on Behalf of Households

Under the Community Services Program's administration of the program, eligible households may receive up to \$500 in benefits. Eligible households can apply for benefits each month. Program staff use a benefits matrix to determine benefit assistance.

# **Priority Populations**

Households that meet program eligibility criteria and fall in one of the following categories will be able to apply through early designated application periods. All those who are categorically eligible for the program will be automatically enrolled.

- ✓ People with disabilities
- √ Families with young children
- ✓ Older Adult/Seniors (55+)
- ✓ Households with high water burden
- √ Veterans
- ✓ Single parents
- √ Foster children

# **Program Outreach Activities**

- Place posters/flyers in local and county social service offices, offices of aging, Social Security offices, Veterans Affairs, etc.
- Work directly with water utilitie to identify potential recipients.
- Include inserts in water vendor billings to inform individuals of the availability of all types of LIHWAP assistance.
- Mass mailing(s) to prior-year LIHEAP recipients or recipients of other government benefits.
- Inform low-income applicants of the availability of all types of LIHWAP assistance at application intake for other low-income program.
- Execute interagency agreements with other lowincome program offices and/or public health pathways created for Covid-19 outreach to perform outreach to target groups.
