# Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

NOOKSACK INDIAN TRIBE LIHWAP PROFILE SUMMARY



The Nooksack Indian Tribe Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is funded at \$36,716 in FY21. The Tribe utilizes LIHWAP grant funds to provide emergency assistance to enable low-income households to access water and wastewater services.

## **Program Operation**

The Nooksack Indian Tribe's LIHWAP, which began in October 2021, is managed by the Department of Social Services in coordination with other programs available to low-income households. The Nooksack Indian Tribe's LIHWAP provides relief assistance to **two priority groups**:

- Households whose water and wastewater services have been disconnected
- Households with existing arrearages at risk of disconnection

Program staff conduct outreach activities, determine client eligibility, and process benefit payments to water service providers.



- Joint application for multiple programs, i.e., LIHEAP, CSBG, EFAP, and LIHWAP
- Social Services Department works closely with the Opportunity Council, Vocational Rehabilitation Program and the local Department of Social and Health Services Office

## **Use of Funding by Funding Source**



#### **Benefits on Behalf of Households**

Under the Department of Social Services' administration of the program, eligible households may receive up to \$500 in benefit assistance. Agency staff use a benefit matrix to determine benefit amounts taking into consideration household income, size, and water burden. Households are eligible to apply for assistance every six months.

#### **Program Outreach Activities**

- Publication of articles or public service announcements in local newspapers or broadcast media announcements.
- Work directly with water utilities to identify potential recipients.
- Inform low-income applicants of the availability of all types of LIHWAP assistance at application intake for other low-income programs.
- Execute interagency agreements with other lowincome program offices and/or public health pathways created for COVID-19 outreach to perform outreach to target groups.
