Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

PIT RIVER TRIBE LIHWAP PROFILE SUMMARY



The Pit River Tribe's Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is funded at \$10,000 in FY21. The Tribe utilizes LIHWAP grant funds to provide emergency assistance to enable low-income households to access water and wastewater services.

Program Operation

The Pit River Tribe's LIHWAP, which began in March 2022, is managed and operated at Tribal level in coordination with other programs available to low-income households. The Pit River Tribe's LIHWAP provides relief assistance to to all eligible Tribal members.

- Households with elder adults.
- Households with small children.
- Households that have received shut-off notices and are at-risk of service disconnection

Program staff conduct outreach activities, determine client eligibility, and process benefit payments to water service providers.


- Restoration of services

PROGRAM COORDINATION

- One application for multiple programs, i.e., SNAP, Medicaid, TANF, LIHEAP, and LIHWAP
- Intake referrals when customers apply for assistance for other programs that are offered through the Income Support Division
- One-stop intake centers through the Income Support Field offices located in all 33 counties within the state where customers can apply for benefits
- Coordination with organizations across the state (e.g., food banks statewide, non-profit agencies) that help customers apply for benefits

Benefits on Behalf of Households

Under the Tribe's administration of the program, eligible households may receive \$100 in benefit assistance.

Priority Populations

Households that meet program eligibility criteria and fall in one of the following categories receive priority assistance in the processing of their applications.

- ✓ People with disabilities
- √ Families with young children
- ✓ Older Adult/Seniors (60+)
- ✓ Households with high water burdens

Program Outreach Activities

- Place posters/flyers in local and county social service offices, offices of aging, Social Security offices, Veterans Affairs, etc.
- Work directly with water utilities to identify potential recipients.
- Inclusion of inserts in water vendor billings to inform individuals of the availability of LIHWAP assistance.
- Automated phone campaigns and/or social media outreach.
- Inform low-income applicants of the availability of all types of LIHWAP assistance at application intake for other low-income programs.
