Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

PUEBLO OF ZUNI LIHWAP PROFILE SUMMARY



The Pueblo of Zuni Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is funded at \$247,171 in FY21. The Tribe utilizes LIHWAP grant funds to provide emergency assistance to enable low-income households to access water and wastewater services.

Program Operation

The Pueblo of Zuni LIHWAP, which began in January 2022, is managed by the Pueblo of Zuni Education & Career Development Center (ZECDC) in coordination with other programs available to low-income households. The Pueblo of Zuni's LIHWAP provides relief assistance to **three priority groups**:

- Households whose water and wastewater services have been disconnected
- Households with existing arrearages to prevent disconnection of water and wastewater services
- Households that may need assistance paying their water bills

Program staff conduct outreach activities, determine client eligibility and process benefit payments to water service providers.


- Restoration of services

PROGRAM COORDINATION

- Intake referrals are accepted from Zuni Senior Center and/or any other program that serves the priority population
- All LIHWAP applications are processed through the Pueblo of Zuni Education & Career Development Center (ZECDC)





Benefits on Behalf of Households

Under the Tribe's administration of the program, eligible households may receive up to \$1,200 in benefit assistance. Households may receive assistance twice throughouth the year based on available funding.

Priority Populations

Households that meet program eligibility criteria and fall in one of the following categories receive priority in the early processing of their application.

- ✓ People with disabilities
- √ Families with young children (<6)

- ✓ Older Adult/Seniors (60+)
- ✓ Households with high water burden

Program Outreach Activities

- Place posters/flyers in local and county social service offices, offices of aging, Social Security offices, Veterans Affairs, etc.
- Publication of articles or public service announcements in local newspapers or broadcast media announcements.
- Work directly with water utilities to identify potential recipients.
- Automated phone campaigns and/or social media outreach.
- Inform low-income applicants of the availability of all types of LIHWAP assistance at application intake for other low-income programs.
