Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

SAN CARLOS APACHE TRIBE LIHWAP PROFILE SUMMARY



The San Carlos Apache Tribe's Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is funded at \$310,510 in FY21. The Tribe utilizes LIHWAP grant funds to provide emergency assistance to enable low-income households to access water and wastewater services.

Program Operation

The San Carlos Apache Tribe's LIHWAP, which began in January 2022, is managed and operated by the Tribal Social Services Department in coordination with other programs available to low-income households. The San Carlos Apache Tribe's LIHWAP provides relief assistance to **three priority groups**:

- Households whose water and wastewater services have been disconnected due to nonpayment
- Households with arrearages to prevent disconnection of water services
- Households that need assistance paying their current water bill

Program staff conduct outreach activities, determine client eligibility, and process benefit payments to water service providers.



- Coordination with Tribal TANF
- Collaboration with all 90 tribal programs under San Carlos Apache Tribe
- Information and application distribution via all committees where LIHWAP exists





Benefits on Behalf of Households

Under the Social Services Department's administration of the program, eligible households may receive up to \$5,000 in benefit assistance. Household can apply for assistance each month, for up to seven months.

Priority Populations

Households that meet program eligibility criteria and fall in one of the following categories receive priority assistance.

- ✓ People with disabilities
- √ Families with young children
- ✓ Older Adult/Seniors (60+)
- ✓ Households with high water burden

Program Outreach Activities

- Place posters/flyers in local and county social service offices, offices of aging, Social Security offices, Veterans Affairs, etc.
- Publication of articles or public service announcements in local newspapers or broadcast media announcements.
- Work directly with water utilities to identify potential recipients.
- Inform low-income applicants of the availability of all types of LIHWAP assistance at application intake for other low-income programs.
- Announcements and information distribution via all committees where LIHWAP exists and Tribal radio.
- Advertising through social media and local newspaper Apache Messenger.
