SHOSHONE-BANNOCK TRIBES LIHWAP PROFILE SUMMARY



The Shoshone-Bannock Tribes Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is funded at \$123,926 in FY21. The program addresses two concentrated areas of need within the Reservation: water assistance for clients with overdue water bills and septic pumpting for independent septic systems on the Reservation.. Tribes utilize LIHWAP grant funds to provide emergency assistance to enable low-income households to access water and wastewater services.

Program Operation

The Shoshone-Bannock Tribes' LIHWAP, which began in October 2021, is managed centrally at the Tribal level in coordination with other programs available to low-income households. The Shoshone-Bannock Tribes' LIHWAP provides relief assistance to eligible households through **two activities:**

- Paying a household's overdue water/sewer utility bill
- Assisting a household with paying a septic pumping bill to prevent a backup of sewage into the home

Program staff conduct outreach activities, determine client eligibility, and process benefit payments to water service providers.





PROGRAM COORDINATION

- One application for multiple services that are part of the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes 477 Human Services Program
- Intake referrals to/from the TANF program
- One-stop center that takes all the applications from all the 477 programs and Consumer Services





Benefits on Behalf of Households

Under the Tribes' administration of the program, eligible households may receive a one-time benefit of up to \$1,500

during the fiscal year to cover the cost of a water bill, septic pumping, and water repair. Program staff give preference and expedite the applications of priority populations and households with emergencies to the home like no running water or a possible health risk of a septic back up.

Priority Populations

Households that meet program eligibility criteria **and** fall in one of the following categories receive priority assistance and expedited application processing.

- ✓ People with disabilities
- ✓ Young children
- ✓ Older Adult/Seniors (60+)

Program Outreach Activities

- Publication of articles or public service announcements in local newspapers or broadcast media announcements.
- Mass mailing(s) to prior-year LIHEAP recipients or recipients of other government benefits.
- Inform low-income applicants of the availability of all types of LIHWAP assistance at application intake for other low-income programs.
- Provide information and promote the LIHEAP, LIHWAP, and Tribal Member services at 5 lodges located throughout the reservation.
