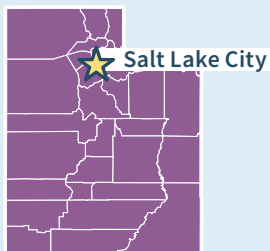


How to Enroll in Your Local Diaper Distribution Pilot Program

How can CAP Utah help my family?

- Families can receive diapers every month.
- Once enrolled in the diaper program pilot, you can also receive help with home visitation, LIHEAP, weatherization, Early Head Start and Head Start, employment services, and WIC.

All of Utah is eligible; please read below for locations of distribution sites.

How do I receive diapers?

You may be eligible if your family is below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines (see <https://aspe.hhs.gov/topics/poverty-economic-mobility/poverty-guidelines>). Exceptions may be made for children in foster care and children with disabilities. Please bring proof of income and proof of identity.
