15 NOTICE TO JUVENILE ALIENS IN FEDERAL FACILITIES FUNDED BY DHS OR
16 HHS BY REASON OF THEIR IMMIGRATION STATUS:

17 Federal law, 8 U.S.C. §§ 1101(a)(27)(J) and 1255, provides a way for certain juveniles who
18 have been abused, abandoned, or neglected to apply for lawful resident status in the United States.
19 This benefit is known as Special Immigrant Juvenile status.
20

21 If you have been abused, abandoned, or neglected, whether in the United States or abroad,
22 you may be eligible to remain lawfully in the United States as a Special Immigrant Juvenile.
23 Special Immigrant Juveniles may also qualify for federal government assistance, including foster
24 care and transitional living assistance.

25 In addition to this notice, you have been given a list of persons and organization in your
26 area that offer free legal assistance to detained immigrants. You may wish to contact one of these
27 legal services providers for more information about whether you can apply for Special Immigrant
28 Juvenile status. These legal services groups may also help you obtain the necessary State court
orders and apply for Special Immigrant Juvenile status and other benefits.
