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## Grant Goals

<b>Program Vision</b>	A Native Community that enjoys physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual wellness.
<b>Program Goals</b>	(1) Improve pregnancy outcomes for Alaska Native and American Indian Families residing in Anchorage and the Matanuska-Susitna Borough. (2) Improve health and developmental outcomes for Alaska Native and American Indian Children. (3) Improve family wellness for Alaska Native and American Indian Families. (4) Ensure the meaningful delivery of high quality, evidenced-based home visiting services. (5) Engage in activities that support early childhood systems development.

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## Implementation Context

<b>State</b>	Alaska
<b>Location of Community</b>	Urban and Rural/Non-Rural Reservation
<b>Population Served</b>	Low income first time mothers and high risk multiparous mothers residing in Southcentral's primary service areas which includes: Municipality of Anchorage and the adjacent Matanuska-Susitna Borough. The small villages of Knik and Chickaloon also receive services.
<b>Ages of Children Served</b>	Prenatal to two years and six months
<b>Model</b>	Nurse Family Partnership
<b>Other Program Components</b>	(1) Adaptation: The program has increased the low income requirements to 300% of the poverty level to reach more families in the community with insufficient resources. (2) Adaptation: The program extends the length of services by 6 months for a subsequent child of an enrolled family delivered before the originally enrolled child's second birthday.

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
