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Program Goals

Four goals of the Yellowhawk Tribal Health Center (YTHC) Tribal Home Visiting Program are to: (1) improve maternal, child health, and parenting outcomes for enrolled families; (2) ensure that the community is focused on family strength and wellness; (3) improve families' access to community services that will support child health, family stability, and parenting; and (4) ensure the sustainability of the home visiting program.

Primary Risk Factors in Target Community	The primary risk factors include historical trauma, widespread alcohol use, alcohol and substance abuse, unmet mental health treatment needs, and difficulty in accessing available services or limited services.

Program Delivery Context

Implementing Agency	The Yellowhawk Tribal Health Center
Organization Type	The Yellowhawk Tribal Health Center is a non-profit, tribally governed, fully accredited ambulatory health clinic.
Target Population	The target population includes children from birth to 5 years old, first time mothers under the age of 21, and pregnant women of any age who meet the Oregon Maternity Case Management high-risk eligibility criteria. Staff of the project will work with the tribal Head Start Program to assist children who have low achievement or developmental disabilities. Families with members who served in the armed forces have high priority for receiving services.
Target and Actual Numbers Served	The Yellowhawk Tribal Health Center Tribal Home Visiting Program will provide home visiting services to 200 children (birth to 5 years) and 450 women of childbearing age (15 to 44 years).

Home Visiting Model Selected

The YTHC Tribal Home Visiting Program selected the Family Spirit (FS) home visiting model.

Key Model Adaptations or Enhancements

The YTHC Tribal Home Visiting Program will encourage program participants to share important cultural teachings. Other enhancements include incorporating lessons about cradleboards, incorporating lessons from Positive Indian Parenting, and using a multigenerational approach to involve community members, such as elders.

Description of Early Childhood System

Presently, no other formal home visiting programs exist for tribal members living on the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation. However, the Early Head Start Program provides home visiting opportunities for families who are currently participating in that program.

Can brief boosters to the Family Spirit curriculum help target risks for parenting stress and low intention to breastfeed identified at baseline screening?
