Qualifications:

- Must be a Professional with human services or public health experience, to include program work in at-risk youth and/or crisis intervention, or a Student pursuing a degree in a Human Services field.
- Must have organizational and time management skills.
- Must be able to analyze and evaluate complex materials.
- Must have comprehensive writing skills.
- Must be comfortable participating in a virtual team environment.
- Must be available to participate in mandatory training webinars.
- Must have ability to effectively utilize the internet and web-based technology.
- Must be fluent in writing and speaking in English.
- Must be committed to the review process for the duration.

Tools Required:

Level of Commitment:

- Participation in approximately three (3) mandatory training sessions.
