## Early Childhood Development

### FEDERAL INVESTMENT ACROSS PROGRAMS:

Since FY2009



### STATE HIGHLIGHTS

- The number of providers enrolled in California's Consortia Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS) rose from 1,009 providers in 2013 to 1,526 providers in 2014.
- In 2011, online orientations to inform potential providers of key licensing regulations for prospective child care were made available in English and Spanish.
- California launched the Enhanced Facility Search Transparency Web site (<http://cclid.ca.gov/PG3581.htm>) in 2014, posting information about licensed centers and large family child care facilities throughout the State.
- Utilizing a "Key Indicators" tool to increase the frequency of inspection, California conducted 13,070 random program inspections from January – August of 2014.
- In 2011, California finalized Early Childhood Educator Competencies to support a strong early care and education workforce.
- In 2013, California released the California Early Childhood Online (CECO) system to house learning modules for infant/toddler and preschool foundations.
