### STATE HIGHLIGHTS

- Participation in the higher levels of Indiana's Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS), Paths to Quality, increased by 39 percent in FY2012.
- The Indiana General Assembly enacted child care laws in 2014 that focused on new requirements for registered ministries and legally license-exempt programs.
- Indiana partnered with the statewide child care resource and referral network to create a robust consumer education Web site. In 2014, 13,886 families searched for child care using the site.
- Indiana contracted with Purdue University for a study to examine the developmental growth and school readiness of children receiving CCDF vouchers.
- The Bureau of Child Care transitioned to the Office of Early Learning and Out-of-School Time, with oversight administering CCDF, the State Pre-K pilot, Paths to Quality QRIS, the Head Start State Collaboration project, and the Indiana Professional Development Network.
