STATE HIGHLIGHTS

- Quality standards were developed and field tested for QUALITYstarsNY, New York's Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS). The standards are aligned with other existing standards for children's learning.
- In FY 2014, New York implemented revised regulations across sectors. Each of these regulatory packages contains enhanced supervision directives, formalization of disaster preparedness and sheltering-in-place requirements, and contemporary health and safety directives.
- New York enhanced professional development opportunities through the development of a Web-based tool for the Core Body of Knowledge.
- A Web-based early childhood cost model was created to provide policymakers with budgetary and financial analyses of existing and proposed programs, services, and policies.
- Chautauqua Opportunities in Dunkirk was named a Head Start Center for Excellence in Early Childhood.
