Section I: Overview

FY 2008 Program Highlights

Nationwide, the Grants to States for the Access and Visitation (AV) program served over 85,000 parents, grandparents, and legal guardians in FY 2008. The States (including the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands) accomplished this with a fixed, annual appropriation of \$10 million plus the required 10 percent State match, where applicable.

Access Services Result in Increased Parenting Time with Children

In FY 2008, 39,692 noncustodial parents (NCPs) increased parenting time with their children. This is a 19-percent increase over FY 2007 when 33,224 NCPs increased parenting time with their children (Chart J).

Number of Parents Served

In FY 2007, 79,558 parents/legal guardians were served. In FY 2008, the number of parents and legal guardians served increased to 85,237, which is the highest number served since the AV program's inception (Chart A).

Nearly Equal Number of Fathers and Mothers Served

Similar to the data reported in FY 2007, nearly equal numbers of mothers (40,315) and fathers (41,196) participated in State-administered Access and Visitation programs in FY 2008. In addition, 3,726 grandparents and/or legal guardians (4 percent of total served) were recipients of AV services (Chart A).

For the first year since FY 2002, the number of fathers served was greater than the number of mothers served.

Efforts Continue to Focus on Unmet Access Needs of Unmarried Parents

Approximately 46 percent of parents served in FY 2008 were unmarried parents, similar to the 44 percent served in FY 2007. In 2008, divorced parents constituted 16 percent of parents served, which is slightly less than the 21 percent served in FY 2007. Twelve percent of parents were separated in FY 2008, while 16 percent were separated in 2007. In FY 2008, 18 percent reported they were married, which is slightly higher than the 15 percent reporting a status of married in FY 2007. Five percent were unknown (no data were reported) in FY 2008 closely aligning with the 4 percent unknown in FY 2007. (Chart E).

Demographics of Parents Served

The majority of parents served in FY 2008 earned a yearly income of less than \$29,000. Based on the race/ethnicity data reported by States, 50 percent of parents served were white; 23 percent were African-American; 18 percent were Hispanic; 2 percent were Asian-American or Pacific Islander; 1 percent were American Indian or Alaskan; 2 percent were Other; and 3 percent were unknown (no data were reported). (Chart G.)

Nationwide, States Deliver a Range of Access/Visitation Services

States determine services to be provided, which include those defined in the authorizing legislation (i.e., mediation, counseling, parent education, development of parenting plans, and visitation enforcement, including supervised visitation and/or neutral drop-off and pick-up). All services must be related to the goal of the AV program which is to support and facilitate NCPs' access to and visitation of their children.

The majority of States continued to provide more than one service, and in many instances, parents are the recipients of more than one service. Listed below are the number of parents that received each service type and the number of States that provided these services in FY 2008.

It is important to note that parents are counted once per service and that the amount of time or service hours devoted to each parent is not collected. As a result, parent education yields high numbers of parents served because it usually entails a one-time-only participation in a 2-4 hour seminar. Supervised visitation, on the other hand, is considered a time-intensive service that an NCP utilizes over a period of time usually determined by the court. (Charts C and D.)

Parent Referral Sources to Access Services

Courts continue to be the primary source of parent referrals (46 percent) to AV services. Child support agencies completed 24 percent of parent referrals in FY 2008, a slight increase from 23 percent in FY 2007 (Chart H).

Local Service Providers

In FY 2008, States contracted with 374 court and/or community-based, non-profit service providers for the delivery of access and visitation services.

Background Information

Designated State Agencies

Statute requires governors to designate the State agency responsible for administering the Access and Visitation Grant program. The majority of State Access and Visitation programs are managed by either State Child Support Enforcement Agencies (30) or State Administrative Offices of the Court (12). The remainder are managed by State Social Service agencies (11); and the Governor's Grants Office (1).

Designated Federal Agency

The Office of Child Support Enforcement, Administration for Children and Families, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services remains officially responsible for managing this grant program.

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Enabling Legislation

The Grants to States for Access and Visitation program (42 U.S.C. 669b) was authorized by Congress through passage of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996.

The goal of the program is to enable States to establish and administer programs to support and facilitate noncustodial parents' access to and visitation of their children.

States are directed to accomplish this goal through the provision of services including, but not limited to:

1. mediation (mandatory and voluntary);
2. counseling;
3. education (e.g., parent education);
4. development of parenting plans;

5. visitation enforcement (including monitored supervision and neutral drop-off/pick-up); and
6. development of guidelines for visitation and alternative custody arrangements.

This is a formula grant program. States have the discretion to decide what services to provide, organizations to be funded, geographic areas to be covered, and persons to be served.

Annual Funding

\$10 million appropriated each year by Congress.

Funding Formula

“The allotment of a State for a fiscal year is the amount that bears the same ratio to \$10,000,000 for grants under this section for the fiscal year as the number of children in the State living with only one (1) biological parent bears to the total number of such children in all States.”

While funding is awarded based on this formula, States are assured a minimum of \$100,000.

Required State Match

States are required by law to provide a minimum 10 percent match of the Federal grant amount. This match requirement can be fulfilled via cash or in-kind contributions by the State and/or local grantees. Guam and the Virgin Islands are exempt from this requirement.

State Reporting Requirements

The enabling legislation requires States to monitor, evaluate, and report on services funded through the Access and Visitation Grant program. This statutory requirement is satisfied through the annual completion of the “State Child Access Program Survey” (see Appendix) which includes:

1. State agency contact information;
2. services funded;
3. provider agency contact information;
4. number of parents served;
5. socio-economic and demographic information of families served; and
6. outcome data (i.e., number of parents whose parenting time with children increased as a result of services).

A Guide to Understanding the Data

Data Source

The data presented is based on State and jurisdiction reports.

Parents Served

The totals represent the number of clients (including parents, legal guardians and grandparents) receiving one or more services.

Service Data

The totals represent the number of clients receiving services by service type. The sum of all clients receiving services could exceed the total number of parents served by the State if clients received more than one type of service.

Definition of Services

Mediation

May include, but is not limited to, court-connected or community-based services involving professionals (certified and trained as family mediators) who meet with both parents and/or guardians to: a) resolve parenting disputes; b) develop a parenting plan and visitation agreement; and c) increase NCP parenting time with children.

Counseling

May include, but is not limited to, services provided by mental health professionals who help parents and/or guardians address their interpersonal conflicts by focusing on the best interests of the child.

Parent Education

May include, but is not limited to, seminars or classes for providing custodial parents and NCPs with information on a range of issues, such as: a) adverse consequences of divorce and parental conflict on children; b) benefits of co-parenting; c) State custody and visitation guidelines; d) court procedures for filing a motion for visitation; and e) importance of developing a parenting plan, etc.

Development of Parenting Plans

May include, but is not limited to, the development of formal or informal parenting plans or parenting agreements through services other than mediation which increase NCP parenting time with children and/or reduce parental conflict over issues related to child access and visitation. Plans may or may not be filed with the court dependent upon the wishes of the parents.

Visitation Enforcement Services

✚ Supervised Visitation

May include, but is not limited to, monitored, therapeutic, and supervised visitation services for NCPs (usually ordered by the court) who would otherwise be denied access to their children.

✚ Neutral Drop-Off/Pick-Up

May include, but is not limited to, services for high-conflict parents and their children in a neutral environment for the safe exchange of a child from one parent to another. These services are often available through community and faith-based organizations and/or supervised visitation centers.

Marital Status

Marital status between biological parents only.

Annual Income & Race/Ethnicity

Self-explanatory.

Source of Client Referrals

Identifies how parents/guardians were referred to access and visitation services reported through this program.

Outcome: Increase in NCP Parenting Time with Children

The number of NCP mothers or fathers who increased parenting time (hourly, daily, weekly, monthly, and/or annually) with their children compared to time spent with their children prior to receiving access and visitation services.

“Unknown” Data Category

State did not collect and/or report data.

Local Service Providers

Sub-grantees providing access and visitation services.

Chart A: Number of Parents/Guardians Served Over Time




Chart B: Number/Percent of Parents/Guardians Served and Children Involved (FY 2008)



Chart C: Number/Percent of Clients Served by Program Activity (FY 2008)



Chart D: Number/Percent of States/Jurisdictions Providing Services by Type (FY 2008)



Chart E: Marital Status of Parents Served (FY 2008)



Chart F: Income Ranges of Parents/Guardians Served (FY 2008)



Chart G: Race/Ethnicity of Parents/Guardians Served (FY 2008)



Chart H: Referral Source for Parents/Guardians to Services (FY 2008)



Chart I: Grouping of States/Jurisdictions by Grant Amount (FY 2008)





Chart J: Program Outcomes: Increase in Parenting Time

State Child Access Program Survey: Instructions

Purpose

The purpose of this survey is to provide information to Congress on the progress of services provided under the Child Access and Visitation Grant, the goal of which is to "...support and facilitate a noncustodial parents' access to and visitation with their children."

As part of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, states are required to monitor, evaluate, and report on programs funded through this grant program in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Secretary. A final rule delineating the program data reporting requirements was published by the federal Office of Child Support Enforcement in the Federal Register (64 FR 15132) on March 30, 1999, and specifies the collection of data as follows:

"Section 303.109(c) REPORTING. The state must:

(1) Report a detailed description of each program funded, providing the following information as appropriate: service providers and administrators, service area (rural/urban), population served (income, race, marital status), program goals, application or referral process (including referral sources), voluntary or mandatory nature of the programs, types of activities and length and features of a completed program; and

(2) Report data including: the number of applicants/referrals for each program, the total number of participating individuals, and the number of persons who have completed program requirements by authorized activities (mediation—voluntary and mandatory, counseling, education, development of parenting plans, visitation enforcement—including monitoring, supervision and neutral drop-off and pickup) and development of guidelines for visitation and alternative custody arrangements."

Survey Components

The *State Child Access Program Survey* is comprised of two-parts: 1) the State Agency Program Survey; and 2) the Local Service Provider Survey.

The state is:

... responsible for summarizing much of the data provided by its grantees and reflecting this information in the "State Agency Program Survey" part of the form. The state is also responsible for making sure that local service providers or grantees complete the "Local Service Provider Survey" part of the form. In the instance a state transfers its child

access grant funds to another state agency (e.g., Office of the Courts) who, in turn, issues grants to local courts and/or community-based organizations, the state must ensure that these “sub-grantees” complete the “Local Service Provider Survey.” Last, the state is responsible for submitting the “*State Child Access Program Survey*” to OCSE by November 30th of each year that the survey is authorized.

The local service provider is:

...responsible for completing the “Local Service Provider Survey” for clients served and submitting this information to the state who, in turn, will submit it to OCSE . A new feature of the survey (see Section D: Local Service Provider Worksheet) requires that grantees report on the following:

REQUIRED OUTCOME:

#1. Increased NCP parenting time with children.
(NCP = non custodial parent)

DEFINITION of Required Outcome:

“An increase in the number of hours, days, weekends, and/or holidays as compared to parenting time prior to the provision of access and visitation services.”

In addition, Section D: Local Service Provider Worksheet was developed to assist service providers in compiling information on clients served. The “Case Reference/Identification Number” can be the same “case” number used by a service provider at client intake. It must be emphasized, however, that personal social security numbers are not to be used since this would be a breach of client confidentiality.

Changes in Reporting Period

In years past, states were required to report on child access programs funded in a particular federal fiscal year after a local grantee’s liquidation of funds (12 – 24 months after state receipt of federal grant). This has been changed. Effective immediately, states will be required to submit their *State Child Access Program Surveys* to OCSE for the fiscal year immediately preceding the reporting date of November 30 of each year.

For example:

By November 30, 2006:
survey due to OCSE on child access programs operating
between October 1, 2005 – September 30, 2006;
