Project Overview

The Employment and Training Evidence Review will conduct a comprehensive review of the evidence base on employment and training programs and strategies for low-income individuals. The review will systematically identify, assess, and synthesize evidence from the existing research literature and then use this synthesis to identify programs and strategies with the strongest evidence of effectiveness. Findings will be disseminated to the research, policy, and practice fields. A primary objective of the review is to identify successful programs and strategies and produce materials and products that will be useful to those interested in implementing evidence-based programs and strategies. The review is being conducted by Mathematica Policy Research.
