

Poverty, Inequality, and Mobility among Hispanic Populations Project Overview

The Office of Planning, Research and Evaluation (OPRE) in collaboration with the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation (ASPE) within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services awarded funding to the National Poverty Research Center at Stanford University – the Stanford Center on Poverty and Inequality - to support research on poverty and inequality among low-income Hispanic populations. The research will focus on areas such as social mobility, health and wellbeing, immigration, new generations and trend analyses.

The Stanford Center on Poverty and Inequality has awarded research grants related to these topic areas, and has established a network of scholars with expertise in low-income Hispanic populations to mentor grantees.
