




Domestic Victims of Human Trafficking Program, FY 2019

In FY 2019, the Office on Trafficking in Persons (OTIP) provided **\$3,198,525** in grant funding to 12 organizations for the Domestic Victims of Human Trafficking (DVHT) Program to provide comprehensive case management, direct services, and referrals through community partnerships to U.S. citizens and Lawful Permanent Residents who have experienced human trafficking (domestic trafficking).

CLIENTS SERVED

DVHT grantees served a total of **825** adults and minors who experienced domestic trafficking in FY 2019.




SERVICES PROVIDED

In FY 2019, clients served by DVHT grantees accessed a wide range of services, including case management, basic necessities like clothing and food, housing, victim advocacy, medical and mental health services, peer to peer or emotional support, substance use treatment, public benefits, and safety planning.

Approximately 89% of the clients served by DVHT grantees were known to have experienced sex trafficking or a combination of sex and labor trafficking in FY 2019.

DVHT grantees are located in Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Illinois, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, Ohio, Oregon, and Utah.

In FY 2019, DVHT grantees identified and served clients in these 12 states through collaborative partnerships with 169 organizations and/or professionals.
