





## Domestic Victims of Human Trafficking Program, FY 2017

The Office on Trafficking in Persons (OTIP) funds the Domestic Victims of Human Trafficking (DVHT) Program, providing grants to 13 organizations to provide comprehensive case management, direct services, and referrals through community partnerships to U.S. citizens and Lawful Permanent Residents who have experienced human trafficking.




### CLIENTS SERVED

DVHT grantees served a total of **636** U.S. citizens and Lawful Permanent Residents who experienced human trafficking in FY 2017.

Approximately 69% of the clients served by DVHT grantees were known to have experienced sex trafficking or a combination of sex and labor trafficking in FY 2017.

### SERVICES PROVIDED

In FY 2017, clients served by DVHT grantees accessed a range of services, including basic necessities like clothing and food, case management, housing services, medical and mental health services, peer to peer or emotional support, substance use treatment, public benefits, advocacy, and safety planning.

DVHT grantees are located in Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Illinois, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, Ohio, Oregon, and Utah.

In FY 2017, DVHT grantees identified and served clients in 11 states through collaborative partnerships with 172 organizations and/or professionals. Two grantees were unable to serve victims while setting up critical aspects of the program.
