




Rescue & Restore Victims of Human Trafficking Regional Program, July 1, 2014— June 30, 2017

The Office on Trafficking in Persons (OTIP) funds the Rescue & Restore Victims of Human Trafficking Regional Program—renamed the Look Beneath the Surface Regional Anti-Trafficking Program. Grantees focused on identifying and referring foreign national victims of human trafficking in 19 communities during the July 1, 2014—June 30, 2017 grant period.



VICTIMS IDENTIFIED

Rescue & Restore grantees identified a total of **1,393** foreign nationals who experienced human trafficking during their project cycle from July 1, 2014—June 30, 2017.



From July 1, 2014—June 30, 2017, grantees held a total of **5,585** outreach events and trained **84,242** individuals to identify and refer potential victims of human trafficking.

Type of Trafficking Experienced by Foreign National Victims of Trafficking Identified by Rescue and Restore Grantees, July 1, 2014 - June 30, 2017



Consistently over the project cycle, over half of the individuals identified through Rescue & Restore experienced labor trafficking (56%), while around 32% experienced sex trafficking and 7% experienced both.
