Partner	Services	Contact
Vocational and Educational Institutions: colleges, universities, community colleges, vocational-technical college	Institutions can provide parents with classes, certificates and degrees, GED services, paid internships, short term training and licensing, and apprenticeships.	
Tribal courts, alternative courts, Elder Circles	Problem solving courts and Elder Circles provide alternative enforcement approaches which can provide wrap-around services including employment support for parents.	
Re-entry services	Re-entry services work with formally incarcerated parents re-entering the tribal community and provide support for housing, employment, healthcare, and mental health services.	
Behavioral Health	Rehabilitation and behavioral services provide both medical and mental health services to address underlying health conditions and clear participants for employment. They also provide as drug and alcohol rehabilitation.	
Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)	Tribal TANF program works with parents to provide financial assistance and employment and job placement services.	
Tribal enterprises, employers, and employment programs	Tribal employment programs provide the tribal community with employment support including training, application and interview support, job placement, subsidized, and transition employment opportunities.	
Local or regional employers	Local employers can share current job openings to match with parents needing employment.

Other tribal nations	Tribal child support programs can partner to share education or training opportunities; share program, labor force, and labor market data; share qualified labor for available jobs; learn program best practices.	
Other governments: federal, state, and county agencies	Tribal child support programs can partner with other governmental entities to share workforce data and connect parents with state and county government employment programs. This partnership could provide parents with education or training services, job placement, job development, and subsidized and transitional employment.	
Non-profits and community-based organizations: fatherhood	Community organizations may offer support to entrepreneurs and small businesses, or provide internship opportunities and job placement.	
Legal services/legal assistance partners	These partners can provide help with criminal record expungement, access to federal bonds for employers, negotiation of fines and fees associated with criminal justice involvement, including license re-instatement, and assistance with parenting time and custody visitation	
Financial assistance and asset building partners	These partners can provide assistance with credit repair, establishing financial accounts with banks and credit unions, financial coaching and budgeting, matched savings accounts, micro-lending
